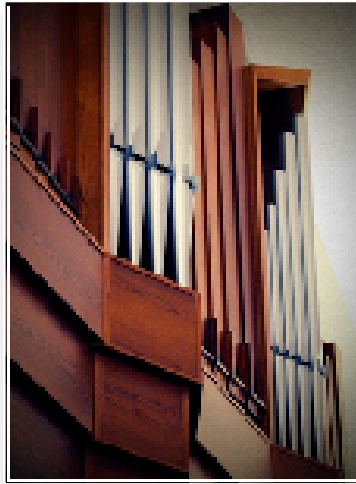
Custom Woodworking - By looking at the pictures in this brochure, it should be apparent that we take a great deal of pride in our how installations look, in addition to how they sound. Our master cabinet maker, Dan Miller, builds new custom organ cases, facades for existing instruments, wind-chests, consoles, and church furnishings such as altars and pulpits. If you can imagine it, he can build it.

Pipe Organ Additions and Rebuilds - We specialize in finding new life in organs that are showing their age. That could mean adding ranks of pipes, digital stops, or MIDI, to enhance the styles of music that an instrument can accommodate. It could also mean replacing worn out mechanical components like leather or relay systems. We have extensive experience in all these areas.

Organist Training and Workshops - Extensive, formal training happens when we install a new or rebuilt organ. Each organist is given ample, hands-on instruction on the operation of a new system. We also give workshops covering topics like registration and contemporary worship.
